

COOK ISLANDS ENERGY STORAGE



How much energy does the Cook Islands use? The Cook Islands is a net importer of energy,in the form of petroleum products. Total energy consumption was 1,677,278,000 BTU (1.77 TJ)in 2017,of which 811,000,000 (0.86 TJ) was in the form of oil. In 2012 47% of imported oil was used in the transport sector,30% in aviation,and 27% for electricity generation.





Does Rarotonga have solar power? The Cook Islands Electricity Sector All inhabited islands of the Cook Islands currently have centralised power supplies that have historically been powered by diesel generators. Since around 2011,increasing solar PV generation on Rarotonga has changed this situation.





Where do most people live in the Cook Islands? Most of the Cook Islands people live in the Southern Islands. Two largest Islands are Rarotonga (main island) and Aitutaki The Government of the Cook Islands has a long standing policy commitment of 100% renewable electricity by 2020.





How many islands are in the Cook Islands? The Cook Islands Located in the South Pacific Ocean,the Cook Islands has 15 islands,of which 12 are inhabited. Most of the Cook Islands 13,000 permanent residents live on Rarotonga,in the south. Aitutaki has a population of approximately 1,800,and remaining islands are sparsely populated. Fig 1.





Rarotonga's microgrid supplies about 11,000 island inhabitants and includes photovoltaic systems, diesel gensets and batteries. The new MTU units will add a total storage capacity of 4,268 kWh and a power output of 4,800 kVA.
