

## GAOTANG ENERGY STORAGE NEWS SAO TOME AND PRINCIPE



Will Sao Tome & Principe get a 2 MW solar project? The island nation of Sao Tome and Principe switched on the initial phase of its first 2 MW solar project in August. Construction of 1.4 MW of PV capacity is now underway at two airports, and developers plan to install a total of 1.7 MW by 2023.



Does Sao Tome & Principe have electricity? The World Bank says Sao Tome and Principe has an electricity access rate of around 76%, with 92% of the total coming from imported diesel.
