





Where is the Falkland Islands located? The Falkland Islands (/??f???? (I) kl??nd,??f??lk -/FAW (L)K-I??nd,FOLK-; [6 ]Spanish: Islas Malvinas [??islas mal????inas]) is an archipelago in the South Atlantic Ocean on the Patagonian Shelf.





Are Falkland Islanders British? Immigration from the United Kingdom,the South Atlantic island of Saint Helena,and Chile has reversed a population decline. The predominant (and official) language is English. Under the British Nationality (Falkland Islands) Act 1983,Falkland Islanders are British citizens.





How did the Falkland Islands get its name? The Falkland Islands derive their name from Falkland Sound, the name given to the waterway between East and West Falkland by Captain John Strong, who spent several days in the Islands on his ship Welfare in 1690. Falkland Sound was itself named after Viscount Falkland, one of the owners of Welfare.





How many islands are in the Falklands? The archipelago, with an area of 4,700 sq mi (12,000 km 2), comprises East Falkland, West Falkland, and 776smaller islands. As a British overseas territory, the Falklands have internal self-governance, but the United Kingdom takes responsibility for their defence and foreign affairs. The capital and largest settlement is Stanley on East Falkland.





What happened to the Falkland Islands? In 1985,the Falkland Islands Dependency was split into the Falkland Islands properand a newly separate territory of South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands. Relations between the UK and Argentina remained hostile after 1982.







How many people live in the Falkland Islands? There are many islands in the group but the two biggest are East Falkland and West Falkland. As of the census of 2016,3,398people live on them. The people of the islands are British and speak English. The main income for the people is from fishing and sheep farming. The Falkland Islands are about 300 miles (480 km) east of Argentina.




